THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST MAY 29, 2016

Hunger characterized all the creatures of this world. Life must be nourished with the proper nutrition. Humans have other hungers, however, and our character as well as our physical health depends on these hungers being appropriately met. We hunger to be useful, to contribute to the needs of others and to a better world. Fulfilling such hunger is critical to our fulfillment.

First reading – Genesis 14:18-20

Bread and wine have symbolized the very presence and the grace of God from the time of Melchizedek to the time of Jesus. The Eucharist is a permanent reminder of the miracles God can perform when we express our gratitude for all that has been done on our behalf, and when we are generous ourselves where the needs of the world are concerned.

Second reading – 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

The Eucharist has many dimensions. There is more to the celebration of the mass than receiving the body and blood of Christ. The symbolism of the mass is a reminder of what the Almighty expects from all of God's sons and daughters. God expects us to become living sacrifices – with our minds and bodies dedicated to God's will.

Gospel – Luke 9:11b-17

What a magnificent lesson the disciples learned on that day when Jesus fed five thousand people with nothing but five loaves and two fish. The disciples had limited themselves to the arithmetic of the earth rather than to the algebra of God. God has a way of increasing the meager into the mighty.

Physical hunger is not something we often experience in our society. We live in one of the better-fed nations of the world. Over-eating is a bigger health problem here than starvation. Obesity is on the rise in our culture. Hunger is difficult to recognize, except in extreme cases. It is also true that we don't see hunger because we don't want to. If hungry people came to us, most of us would feed them. But we don't go looking for them. So, we face the dilemma without being aware of it. Today's reading from Luke is about Jesus and hungry people. But what does this have to do with us? It almost seems irrelevant. But, is it?

Notice, for example, that the people in this story were not on the verge of starvation. They were simply hungry. They had gone without food all day and were ready to eat. Jesus was eager to feed them. God wants all people to be well-fed. God cares deeply for the starving children in Africa and Asia. Sure, you say, and we wish there was some way to help them more directly. But God also cares for hungry people here in our own land. They may not be starving to death, or showing signs of malnutrition, but they are still hungry because they do not have enough to eat. There is the child who goes to school without breakfast because there is no food in the house. There are the elderly who seldom eat a decent meal because they lack the strength and energy to prepare it. There are the street people who eat the produce that grocery stores throw away. There are the addicts who spend their money on drugs and have nothing left with which to buy food. God cares deeply about all of these. We must work and pray for the end of hunger.

TIM'S TIDBITS

Today gives us an opportunity to reflect on our celebration of the Eucharist in a way that we may not have time for on Holy Thursday. This action is central to who we are as Christians. It defines us and builds up the Church as the Body of Christ in the world so that we can continue Jesus' mission on earth.

"This Eucharistic day, observed with such solemnity throughout the world, began in a quiet Belgian convent in the thirteenth century, with the vision of a holy nun, St. Juliana. In her vision, she saw the moon, full and bright. It was glorious, except that one part of its disk was in shadow. The meaning of the vision was then revealed to her: the moon represented the liturgical year; the shadow, a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Juliana spoke to her confessor about what she had seen. Amazingly, within thirty-five years, Pope Urban IV had established the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, in the Church's universal calendar. Hundreds of years later, in 1849, Pope Pius IX added the Feast of the Precious Blood celebrated on July 1. Following the Second Vatican Council, the two liturgies became one solemnity in honor of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

Of course, we already had a day honoring the Eucharist: the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, which includes a procession with the Blessed Sacrament. But the purpose and the moon of the two processions are strikingly different.

On Holy Thursday, we walk with Jesus to the Mount of Olives, to keep watch with him on the night of his betrayal. The sacrament is carried in a ciborium, covered with the humeral veil: and Christ's glory, too, is veiled as he undergoes his Passion. On Corpus Christi, we walk in the afterglow of Easter Time, in company with the Risen Lord. This time, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in a monstrance: the Lord's glory is not hidden, but visible to all." (Sourcebook, 2016)

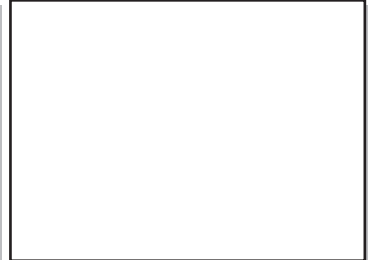
