

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS



During Tuesday's Meeting Members to Consider Pancake Charity and Change in By-Laws Pancakes and a proposed change in the by-laws are the main items on the agenda for Tuesday's membership meeting. Pancake Event Manager Dave Bednarski will first be looking for helpers for the Jan. 22 event, which will

serve breakfast for parishioners from about 9:15 AM to about Noon, after the 8:30 and 10:15 masses. He will be circulating a sign-up sheet. If you are unable to attend the meeting, let him know if you can help with a phone call (734-368-8373) or e-mail (dbednarski 99@yahoo.com).

He also will ask members to continue a practice started several years ago of devoting the net proceeds of the winter pancake breakfast to a charitable cause. Last year profits went to a memorial honoring Msgr. Ed Baldwin; the year before proceeds went to the St. Gerald St. Vincent de Paul efforts. This year Council officers voted to donate proceeds to buy badly needed audio-visual equipment for the St. Gerald Religious Education Department. Members will be asked to ratify that decision.

Members also will be asked to approve an amendment to the Council by-laws that was discussed last month. The by-law amendment is needed in order to satisfy a clause in the State of Michigan license application that would qualify the Council to raise funds through a millionaire party partnership. While study continues on the feasibility of the Council participating in a party operation, it was decided last month to apply for a license.

The amendment reads as follows: "In the event the St. Gerald Council 13673 is dissolved, ownership of all assets, including physical property, cash and saving instruments will be transferred to St. Gerald Catholic Church." Speaking of the by-laws, brothers who joined the Council after June 2012 should have received a by-laws booklet. If you did not, see Recorder Roger Stacey for a copy at Tuesday's meeting.

Looking Ahead—Jan. 29 is Family Communion Sunday at the 10:15 Mass; Feb. 28 is when we cook at the Parish Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper; Casino bus trip on March 8, and on March 28 we help with the Parish Soup Supper.
