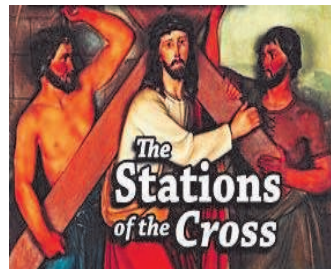

**TIM'S TIDBITS**

We now enter the fourth week of Lent. This past Monday, Spring sprung. We are on our way to Easter. The daylight is longer. In our second reading today from Paul's letter to the Ephesians, we hear: "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light." We, as Christians, are meant to live in the light of Christ. Let us walk with each other and bring that light to the world.

*About Liturgy* (taken from Living Liturgy, 2017)

*Authentic worship, participation, and Body of Christ:* In the five decades after Vatican Council II there have been many calls for full, conscious, and active participation in the church's liturgy. This is probably one of the best known of the council's decisions. But participating in the ritual actions themselves is only one aspect of what the council fathers desired.

The council fathers also called for the renewal of our identity as those baptized in Christ, the Body of Christ who participates in Jesus' paschal mystery. One sign of authentic worship and participation, then, is how we are together the Body of Christ (that is, the church). Authentic worship always calls us outside of ourselves into something bigger than any one of us. Authentic worship demands of us the willingness to surrender ourselves - which means even our personal tastes and desires in how we might want to worship - in order for the Body of Christ to be strengthened.

This may seem a contradiction because worship, in one sense, is a deeply personal act - so why should we give up our personal tastes and desires? The real issue here is that the *surrender* is intensely personal and that is far more important than our personal tastes and desires. The Body of Christ comes to full statue when our own *surrender* is joined to others' surrender and something new - Christ's life - bursts forth. This is when worship is exciting and fruitful: when worship calls us beyond ourselves, when we receive gifts from God through others, and when we then return those gifts to the community in mission. Have a prayerful week.

**Tuesday's Soup Supper Marks Debut of Christian Service Leader Matthew Yokom, Also K of C Founder's Day**

The Christian Service Commission on March 28 resumes its sponsorship of the Lenten Soup Supper. Last year it was a pot-luck affair after skipping a couple of years. The Knights will again be in the kitchen heating and dishing out five different soups, including Grand Knight Fred Gerometta's ham and pea. Fred's soup, made using a secret recipe brought from Italy many years ago by his grandfather, has become a popular choice of parishioners.

The supper also will make the debut of our new parish Christian Service coordinator, Matthew Yokom. He will join Karen Goheen in running the soup supper. Matthew is a student at Madonna University and will be working with the parish part-time. For Soup Supper ticket information and serving times, see the enclosed flyer.

March 28 also is a big day for the Knights of Columbus. It marks the founding of our order 135 years ago in New Haven, Conn. by a young parish priest, Fr. Michael J. McGivney. He called a small meeting of men at St. Mary parish in 1882 who formed a society designed to strengthen the men in their Catholic faith and to provide financial assistance for widows and orphans. Later called the Knights of Columbus, that group has grown into the largest Catholic men's organization in the world. Wear your Council shirt to the Soup Supper in celebration of the anniversary of our founding. Be proud of the special brotherhood that involves membership in the Knights of Columbus.

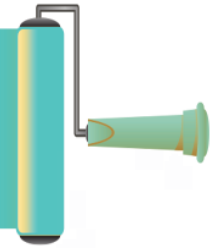
