STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Today, in St. Mark’s processional Gospel passage, the evangelist retells of Jesus’ glorious and triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Christ’s travel on a colt signifies that He is a different leader, not a Roman conqueror or king, but a Messianic King. He is a humble, suffering servant Who, as portrayed in St. Mark’s Passion account, will sacrifice His life for all seeking eternal salvation. The prophet Isaiah professes how the Lord God leads and strengthens all those in difficult situations. St. Paul proclaims how Christ humbly emptied Himself, becoming human and dying for our salvation so God could exalt Him — *that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend ... and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord!* Do we, as faithful stewards, acknowledge God’s tremendous gift of His Son by opening our hearts to a personal relationship with Him? Following Palm Sunday Mass, make crosses or other religious symbols from your blessed palms. Throughout the year, these transformed palms will serve as a reminder of Jesus’ invitation to a life of peace and joy with our Lord and Savior.

PALM SUNDAY

It was during the fourth century in Jerusalem that Christians first starting using palm branches in commemoration of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. Today, we continue to use palms in most churches on this Sunday, Catholic and Protestant alike. It is one of those traditions of worship that, no matter how far apart we may seem at times, we continue to share due to our common heritage.



But Palm Sunday is also known as Passion Sunday, because we hear an account of the passion of Jesus Christ during the liturgy. Most churches also share this reading in common. Many Catholic parishes use multiple lectors to proclaim the Gospel, while it is not uncommon for a similar reading or even a performance in many mainstream Protestant churches.

The commonality found in the worship on this particular Sunday seems to highlight the fundamental truth in the observance: Jesus Christ died for everyone. He did not die on a cross for just Catholics, or just Orthodox, or just Protestants. Whether one acknowledges it or not, he was crucified for all those who are born of man. Today, we rejoice not just for what he has done for us but also for what he has done for all of creation.

THE EASTER TRIDUUM**What we do from Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday?**

Holy Thursday brings the end to Lent. That night we begin the Three Days that are the center of the Church's year. Why are these Three Days so important? What do they mean for you? You are invited to make these Three Days different from all the days of the year.

Adults in the community are invited to plan ahead so that the whole time from Thursday night until the Easter Vigil is free of social engagements, free even of work, free of entertainment, free of meals except for the simplest nourishment. We are asked to fast during Good Friday and to continue fasting, if possible, all through Holy Saturday as strictly as we can. We make Good Friday and Holy Saturday free for prayer and reflection and preparation and silence. The church is getting ready.

Whether you are young or old, currently active in the parish or not, please set these days aside. All of us should know that our presence for the liturgies is not just by invitation. We are all needed here. All of us need this whole community together on its greatest days. Please look closely at the parish schedule and make plans to take part in the various liturgies and other gatherings of Holy Thursday night, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Above all, come on Saturday night for the Easter Vigil.

We Begin as Holy Thursday Ends

Thursday evening we enter into the Triduum together. After listening to the scriptures, we do something strange: We wash feet. Jesus gave us this image of what the church is supposed to look like, feel like, act like. This is rehearsal for Christian life.

Later, we celebrate the Eucharist. The evening liturgy has no ending: Whether we stay to pray awhile or leave, we are now in the quiet and peace and glory of the Triduum.

And We Continue through Good Friday and Holy Saturday

We gather quietly on Friday and listen to scripture. We pray at length for all the world's needs. Then there is another once-a-year event: The holy cross is held up in our midst and we come forward one by one to do reverence with kiss or a bow or a genuflection. We also receive communion. It was consecrated last night at the Mass of the Lord's Supper.

We continue in fasting and prayer and vigil, in rest and quiet through Saturday. This Saturday for us is like God's rest at the end of creation. It is Christ's repose in the tomb.

Until the Night between Saturday and Sunday

Excited, the church gathers in the darkness and lights a new fire and a great candle that will make this night bright for us. We listen to some of the most powerful scriptures in the Bible, then we bless the waters. These are the moments when death and life meet, when we reject evil and give our promises to God. Together we go to the table and celebrate the Easter Eucharist. Easter Sunday begins and we are ready for Fifty Days of rejoicing.

At the Easter Vigil Liturgy, please bring bells to ring during the singing of the GLORIA.

Council 13673 Members Get Notice of April 17 Start of Annual Nomination and Election of Officers

If you are a member of Council 13673, this is your official notice of the election of officers for terms beginning July 1, 2018. Nominations will open at the April 17 Membership Meeting and close during the May 15 Membership Meeting when they are followed by the voting. Nominees must have attained the Third Degree of the Order and be in good standing. A nominee can be proposed for office by another member in good standing or nominate himself. A nominee must formally notify the Election Committee chair of his acceptance or rejection of the nomination prior to the voting period.

The following offices are involved in the election process: Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight, Chancellor, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, Advocate, Warden, two Guards and a Trustee. All positions are for terms of one year, except Trustee, whose term will end on 2021. However, during the term of Grand Knight Darren Losey (2014-15) a succession policy was adopted covering the three top positions – Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight and Chancellor – who would serve two years in each position. The goal is to insure that Council leaders are trained and familiar with procedures and policies. A description of each Council office will be e-mailed or mailed to all members prior to the opening of nominations. Members must be present at meetings to nominate and elect. GK Fred Gerometta will appoint an Election Committee Chair at the April 3 officers meeting.

PGK Rich Smith already has started preparations for the annual Memorial Mass, where we honor the deceased members of our Council. He could use a couple of members to help with the Mass and the reception that will follow. Contact Smith at 248-747-6817. The Mass will be at 7 PM on Thursday, May 24.

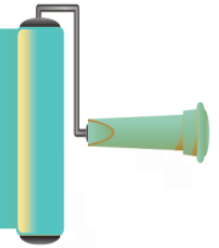
