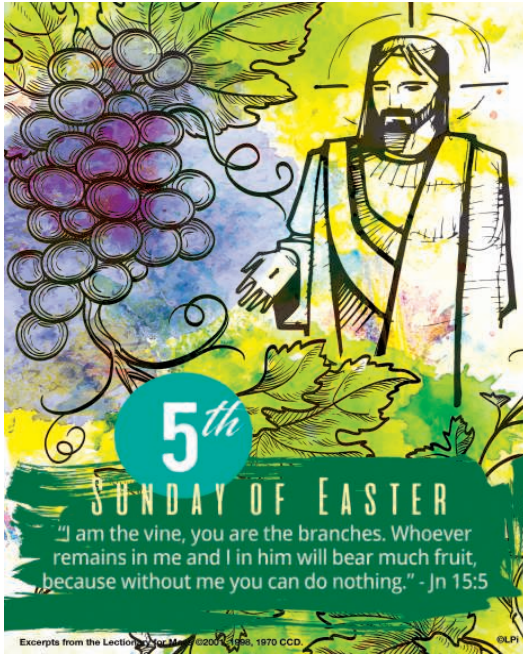

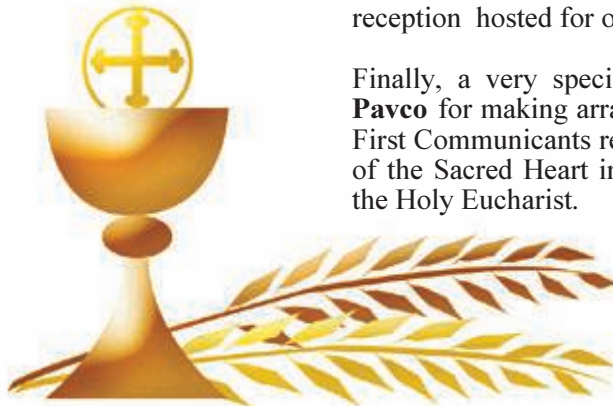
RITE OF RECONCILIATION

KNIGHTS CORNER

Answer the Call, Sign Up to Serve at the Noon Mass Next Sunday

Fr. Kris, our Pastor and Council Chaplain, is calling upon St. Gerald Knights for service at next Sunday’s Noon Mass. He asked that the Knights provide ushers, Eucharistic Ministers, altar servers and a reader for one Mass a month at Noon. In recent months, many of those positions have been unfilled at that Mass.

GK Fred Gerometta promised Fr. Kris the Knights would pick up the challenge. Actually, the job is not as daunting as it looks. Two Knights, PGK Bruce Roberts and Jerry Panyard have been regular ushers at Noon for years. PGK Patrick Rogers and Rick Stone are experienced lectors. And at least a half-dozen Knights are ushers and several more are Eucharistic Ministers. So the problem is reduced to one of scheduling and training members. If you can help May 6, give Fred a call at 248-763-3196.

If any of you have prowled around the Supreme Council website –www.kofc.org – or the Michigan Council website ---- www.mikofc.org -- you probably have discovered a pamphlet called *Into The Breach*. It is an apostolic exhortation to Catholic men by the Most Rev. Thomas J. Olmsted, Bishop of Phoenix. For those of you who haven’t visited those websites, we will provide excerpts from that tract. The Bishop reports that “The world is under attack by Satan as our Lord said it would be (1 Peter 5:8-14). The battle is occurring in the Church herself, and the devastation is all too evident. Since AD 2000, 14 million Catholics have left the faith, parish religious education of children has dropped by 24%, Catholic school attendance has dropped by 19%, infant baptism has dropped by 28%, adult baptism has dropped by 31%, and sacramental Catholic marriages have dropped by 41%. One of the key reasons that the Church is faltering, the Bishop writes, is that many Catholic men “have left the faith and many who remain Catholic, practice the faith timidly and are only minimally committed to pass the faith on to their children.” He notes that “large numbers of Catholic men are failing to keep the promises they made at their children’s Baptisms - promises to bring them to Christ and raise them in the faith of the Church.”

“This crisis is evident in the discouragement and disengagement of Catholic men like you and me”, he noted. “So I call upon you to open your minds and hearts to Him, the Savior who strengthens you to step into the breach!”
