THE EASTER TRIDUUM

What we do from Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday?

Holy Thursday brings the end to Lent. That night we begin the Three Days that are the center of the Church's year. Why are these Three Days so important? What do they mean for you? You are invited to make these Three Days different from all the days of the year.

Adults in the community are invited to plan ahead so that the whole time from Thursday night until the Easter Vigil is free of social engagements, free even of work, free of entertainment, free of meals except for the simplest nourishment. We are asked to fast during Good Friday and to continue fasting, if possible, all through Holy Saturday as strictly as we can. We make Good Friday and Holy Saturday free for prayer and reflection and preparation and silence. The church is getting ready.

Whether you are young or old, currently active in the parish or not, please set these days aside. All of us should know that our presence for the liturgies is not just by invitation. We are all needed here. All of us need this whole community together on its greatest days. Please look closely at the parish schedule and make plans to take part in the various liturgies and other gatherings of Holy Thursday night, Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Above all, come on Saturday night for the Easter Vigil.

We Begin as Holy Thursday Ends

Thursday evening we enter into the Triduum together. After listening to the scriptures, we do something strange: We wash feet. Jesus gave us this image of what the church is supposed to look like, feel like, act like. This is rehearsal for Christian life.

Later, we celebrate the Eucharist. The evening liturgy has no ending: Whether we stay to pray awhile or leave, we are now in the quiet and peace and glory of the Triduum.

And We Continue through Good Friday and Holy Saturday

We gather quietly on Friday and listen to scripture. We pray at length for all the world's needs. Then there is another once-a-year event: The holy cross is held up in our midst and we come forward one by one to do reverence with kiss or a bow or a genuflection. We also receive communion. It was consecrated last night at the Mass of the Lord's Supper.

We continue in fasting and prayer and vigil, in rest and quiet through Saturday. This Saturday for us is like God's rest at the end of creation. It is Christ's repose in the tomb.

Until the Night between Saturday and Sunday

Excited, the church gathers in the darkness and lights a new fire and a great candle that will make this night bright for us. We listen to some of the most powerful scriptures in the Bible, then we bless the waters. These are the moments when death and life meet, when we reject evil and give our promises to God. Together we go to the table and celebrate the Easter Eucharist. Easter Sunday begins and we are ready for Fifty Days of rejoicing.

At the Easter Vigil Liturgy, please bring bells to ring during the singing of the GLORIA.

We welcome Eddie Lowen to St. Gerald. Eddie will be sharing his story of how God touched his life through loss and lessons learned and how to follow Christ in his life.

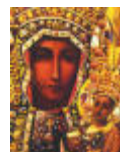
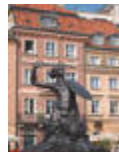

DAY 1 - Sept. 8, Sunday USA - WARSAW

Depart from the USA on an overnight flight to Warsaw. Dinner and breakfast onboard. /D./

DAY 2 - Sept. 9, Monday WARSAW

After arrival, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. Afternoon a walking tour of Old Town followed by very elegant welcome dinner. /B.D./

DAY 3 - Sept. 10, Tuesday WARSAW - WILANOW

After breakfast a sightseeing tour of Old Town, beautifully rebuilt after World War II, with the impressive Royal Castle with its 300 rooms (will visit the Canaletto Room with 23 of his paintings, the Throne Room, the magnificent Knight's Hall and the Royal Ballroom). Afternoon we drive to Wilanow to the beautiful Baroque royal residence park and gardens built in 1674-96 by King Jan III Sobieski. Over the centuries the palace belonged to many Polish noble families like: Sienawskis, Czartoryskis, Lubomirskis, Potockis and Branickis. Dinner in Wilanow. Overnight in Warszawa. /B.L./

DAY 4 - Sept. 11, Wednesday WARSAW - NIEPOKALANOW - CZESTOCHOWA

Morning departure for Czestochowa to visit the Jasna Gora Monastery and the Black Madonna Shrine. On the way we visit and attend the Mass at the Monastery in Niepokalanow, established by St. Maksymilian Kolbe in 1927, who gave his life in exchange for the life of another man in Auschwitz concentration camp in August 1941. Afternoon we arrive in Czestochowa. Short tour of Jasna Gora. Overnight in Czestochowa. /B.L./

DAY 5 - Sept. 12, Thursday CZESTOCHOWA - ZAKOPANE

Holy Mass at the Virgin Mary Shrine housing the icon of Black Madonna, Jasna Góra's most precious treasure to which miraculous powers are attributed. Founded in 1382 by Pauline monks from Hungary. From here we continue to sightseeing of breath-taking Zakopane Enjoyable evening of walking tour of famous Krupowki street. Later you will have a chance to admire Zakopane from the top of the Gubalowka mountain. Overnight in Zakopane. /B.L./

DAY 6 - Sept. 13, Friday ZAKOPANE

Today we explore Zakopane. Beautifully situated at the foot of the Tatra Mountains, in the valley between Gubalowka and Giewont. It is the most popular resort and one of the most beautiful places in all of Poland. After Breakfast, we continue our excursion to Morskie Oko, the largest and most majestic lake in Tatras. On the way back, we will visit Jaszczurowka Chapel and St. Mary's of Czestochowa Church, the oldest wooden church in Zakopane built between 1847-1851. Dinner with folkloric show at one of Highlander's famous restaurant. Overnight in Zakopane. /B.D./

DAY 7 - Sept. 14, Saturday ZAKOPANE - LAGIEWNIKI - KRAKOW

Morning departure for Krakow via Lagiewniki where we will visit the Divine Mercy Sanctuary associated with life of St. Sister Faustyna Kowalska, and the cult of Divine Mercy. After arrival in Krakow, we tour the magnificent Wawel Castle. This most priceless complex was a home of three Polish royal dynasties of Piasts, Jagiellonians and Wazas for six centuries. Overnight in Krakow. /B.D./

DAY 8 - Sept. 15, Sunday KRAKOW - WIELICZKA

Today we visit the famous St. Mary's Basilica, Cloth Hall and Old Market Square built in 1349. Next we drive to Wieliczka, the oldest salt mine in Europe. We explore the underground world of salt chambers, monuments and fabulous St. Kinga Chapel with its beautiful chandeliers, a masterpiece carved in salt by generations of Polish miners. Overnight in Krakow. /B.D./

DAY 9 - Sept. 16, Monday KRAKOW - AUSCHWITZ - WADOWICE

After breakfast, we leave for Auschwitz, the site of the former Nazi Concentration Camp Auschwitz-Birkenau. In the afternoon, we return to Krakow via Wadowice, the birthplace of Pope John Paul II. You will visit the house where he was born and grew up and the Basilica where he was baptized. We attend the Holy Mass. Overnight in Krakow. /B.L./

DAY 10 - Sept. 17, Tuesday KRAKOW - WARSZAWA

After breakfast, visit specialty stores and gift shops to pick up unique and cool souvenirs. From here we drive to Warszawa. Free time in afternoon in Warszawa. In the evening, Farewell Dinner at one of famous restaurant in Old Town. Overnight in Warszawa. /B.D./

DAY 11 - Sept. 18, Wednesday WARSAW

Transfer to airport for the return flight home. Breakfast and dinner onboard. /B.D./

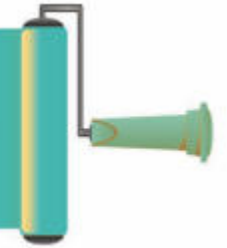
