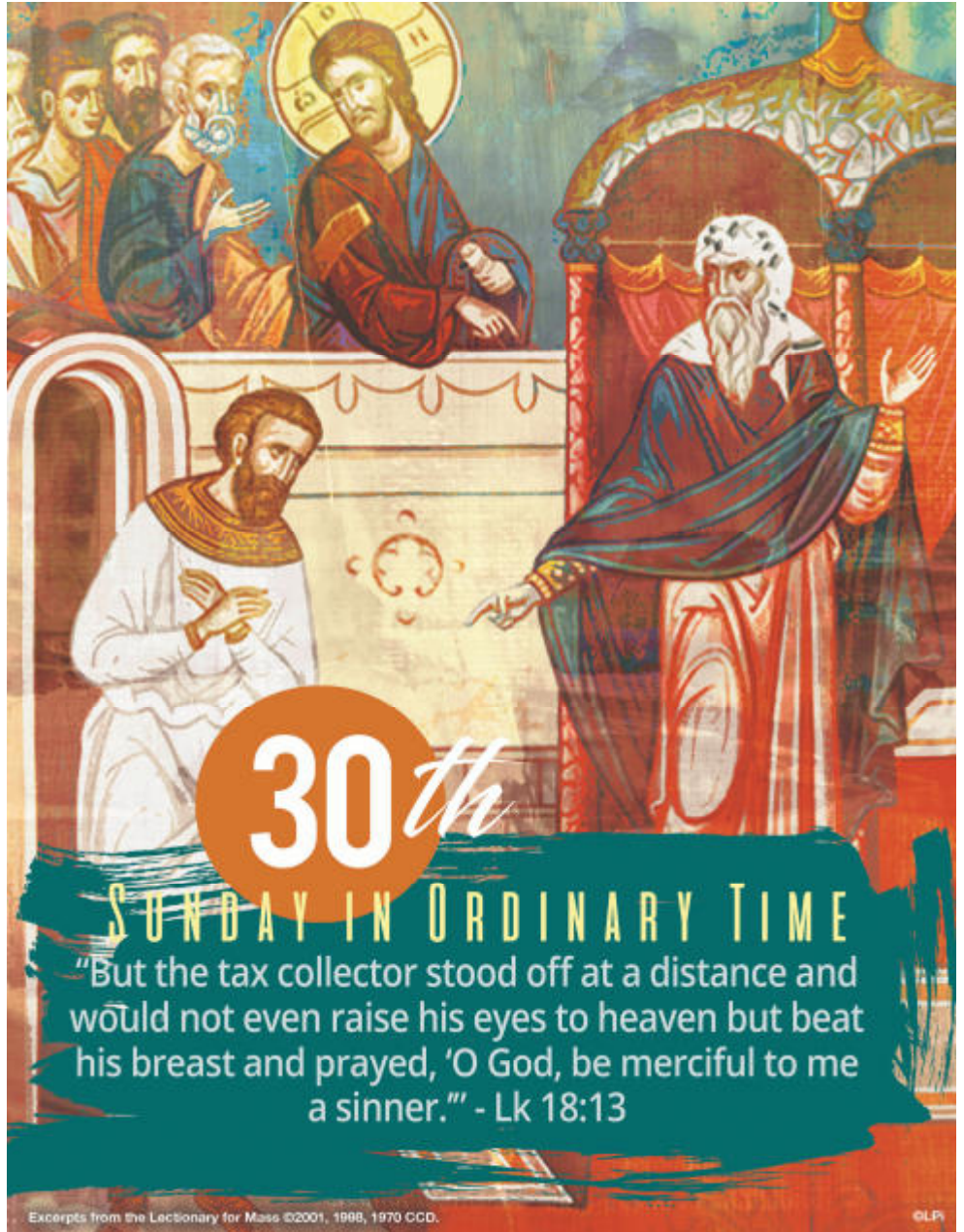

If you were going to run a race, wouldn't you need to train? My wife is not a runner, but a few years back, she wanted to participate in a race with my youngest son. She embarked on a journey which included a healthy diet, exercise, and a lot of running. After several months, she was ready. The race came and went but what remained was a sense of accomplishment. She would have never made it through that event if not for her training. When the time came, she was ready.

Our life in Christ is a race of sorts. It is not a race that starts and stops again and again but one that continues from our baptism until eternal life with him (hopefully). Even though we never stop the race, we do have moments where we need to hydrate, take nourishment, and gain strength. That's what we do at the Mass and in our parish community. It is in our parish where we find what we need to keep running that race.

The problem is that too many assume we only are running the race when we are involved with the parish. Living out our discipleship in stewardship is not only to be done in the Church. In fact, what we do in the Church is to prepare us for what we are called to do during all the times we are not at Church. We encounter Christ in his Church so that we may bring him into a world that needs him. In community, we train and take nourishment so that we have any chance of running the race every day. Annual Sweatshirt Drive Underway to Help At-Risk Youngsters at Holy Cross Children Center

With the formal installation of officers on the books and confirmation completed of the final tally of the proceeds from the October 12-13 Tootsie Roll sale, the Council's attention turns to the annual sweatshirt drive to aid the at-risk kids at Holy Cross Children Services.

PGK Rich Smith announced the start of the drive that seeks to collect 96 hooded sweatshirts by December 8. The hoodies should be size large through XXL and should carry a collegiate name, if possible. Please wrap the shirt and mark the size on the outside of the wrapping. Leave the box on the Knight's table in the corner of the Social Hall.

Smith who also is one of the organizers of the Council sponsored casino bus trip announced that he is building a waitlist for the November 6 trip. "It is sold out now", he said, "but there always are cancelations." The bus will leave the church parking lot at 9 AM and return home from the FireKeepers Casino outside Battle Creek about 6 PM. Tickets are \$35 per person with that cost being offset by \$25 worth of credits for playing and food. The net cost is \$10 for a full day's outing.

Reservations are being accepted for a prayerful weekend with brother Knights December 13-15 at the St. Paul Retreat Center. This is the second annual all Knights retreat sponsored by the Michigan State Council. The weekend begins at 4:30 PM Friday and has time for daily Mass, opportunities for reconciliation, spiritual guidance, rest and solitude, five meals and a private room. The suggested donation is \$215 but is not required. Brother Claude Centers is leading our Council's delegation. Register on line at st.paulretreat.org or by calling Cathy at 313-286-2801. Thanks to the generous response of our parishioners the Tootsie Roll sale earlier this month to help the mentally impaired, generated a net of \$975. The first 20% has to go to the State Council's efforts in behalf of Michigan Special Olympics. The remainder of \$780 will be split among Community Living Centers, which operate group homes in the area, and Farmington Special Olympics which includes among its volunteers the families of Brother Peter Becks and Chancellor Terry Grabinski.

Congratulations to Scott Horsburgh and Paul Borchert who attained the Second and Third Degrees of our order. Both men have shown a willingness to work toward the success of our Council.

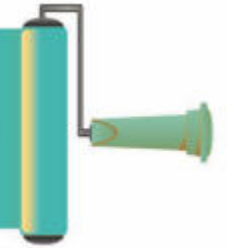
