

Reading 1

Acts 10:25-26, 34-35,44-48/56

When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being." Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." Hello,

My name is Fr. Craig Giera, and I am the Director of Priestly Vocations for the Archdiocese of Detroit. You may have heard that we have a vocation crisis going on in our world, but that's not exactly true. God has not stopped calling men to the priesthood. Rather, we have a hearing problem or a listening problem. Because this world is so loud and noisy, men aren't hearing God's generous offer to become a priest. And because of that, that means less priests serve you.

In just ten years, here in the Archdiocese of Detroit, there is going to be half the number of active priests than those serving today. That means less Masses being said, less confessions being heard, priests not there to be able to celebrate in the joys, and to be with you there through the struggles. I don't say this to cause despair, but rather to stir up that gift of hope that was given to us at our baptism, that theological virtue that says we have already won in Christ. God will provide the grace that we need to accept this challenge. Yet, we need to do our part.

Our response is prayer. Prayer is powerful and not a consolation prize. I have consecrated the vocations department, all its work, and all the young men in the Archdiocese of Detroit who do have a vocation to the priesthood to her Immaculate Heart, that she will protect and guide them. But I have also committed to saying an extra Rosary every single day — the Luminous Mysteries for priestly vocations — and I invite you to do the same. If you can't do it every day, maybe at least once a week. Can you imagine that if even just half the Archdiocese prayed a Rosary a day for vocations, the generous response we would receive? You can register on our website at www.detroitpriestlyvocations.com if you would like to make an ongoing commitment.

Our second response is to encourage and invite our grandsons, sons, nephews— someone in our life that we think has the characteristics to make a good and holy priest. It would be great to sit them down and make it a sacred moment, a special moment. Saying, "I believe you would make a good priest. I'll pray with you on that. I'll be here for you." You would be a St. Barnabas to them, one who offers encouragement!

I'm so excited to share with you our website at www.detroitpriestlyvocations.com. In it, you'll find many resources that will help support priestly vocations. There's also many resources for men who are discerning the call to the priesthood. Check out our podcast, "Men of the Hearts"; we talk to priests about their vocation stories.

Brothers and sisters, St. Paul reminds us that hope does not disappoint because the love of Christ has been poured forth into our hearts. Together let us hope, but also to pray, invite, and encourage young men to consider the priesthood. I'm so happy to be here with you this week to pray for more vocations.

2024 CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL

Our 2024 CSA Campaign has started! We are asking all parishioners to join in contributing to this years' Catholic Services Appeal. If we all give, we will easily meet St. Gerald's 2024 CSA target of \$55,164.00, which is our parish share of the support for the CSA-funded ministries, programs, and services. When we support the CSA, together we focus With Eyes Fixed on Jesus to Witness Christ as His disciples.

We have received refunds from CSA 2022 & 2023 for approximately \$17,000.00. Those funds received from CSA along with funds from savings will be used to replace all the exterior doors in July with a cost of \$87,000.00.

In order for us to make our goal and to help with money coming back to the church in a refund we are asking each family to donate \$300.00. We know that some families can afford more and some not so much. We are asking everyone to donate something to allow us to reach that goal. If you cannot donate at this time, please still return your card showing zero. Remember, we get 100% refund for everything over our goal but any shortfall would be paid from St. Gerald's bank account.

There are various ways for you to support the CSA. You may make a one-time gift or pledge the gift using your credit card making monthly or quarterly payments. Whatever, you decide the campaign for CSA 2024 will be completed by April 30, 2025.


