



SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading 1 Genesis 18:1-10a

The LORD appeared to Abraham by the terebinth of Mamre, as he sat in the entrance of his tent, while the day was growing hot. Looking up, Abraham saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them; and bowing to the ground, he said: "Sir, if I may ask you this favor, please do not go on past your servant. Let some water be brought, that you may bathe your feet, and then rest yourselves under the tree. Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves; and afterward you may go on your way." The men replied, "Very well, do as you have said." Abraham hastened into the tent and told Sarah, "Quick, three measures of fine flour! Knead it and make rolls." He ran to the herd, picked out a tender, choice steer, and gave it to a servant, who quickly prepared it. Then Abraham got some curds and milk, as well as the steer that had been prepared, and set these before the three men; and he waited on them under the tree while they ate. 

What is Evangelizing?

Evangelizing is sharing the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ with every human person. [Jesus] said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to the whole creation..." (Mk 16:15) As intentional Disciples of Christ and as Catholics, this is our mission. Not only must we share the Gospel, we should be seeking to convert individuals and society by the divine power of the Gospel itself. We evangelize by word and deeds. Our lives should reflect the truth and the joy of the Gospel.

There are simple ways to begin evangelizing if you don't know where to start. You don't have to stand on a street corner or go door to door to share the Good News. Here are six simple things you can do.

Live your Catholic faith by what you say and what do. Have the heart and mind of Jesus. You are His hands and feet.

Demonstrate the love of God through faithful and generous friendship.

Bring a godly perspective to conversations.

Learn Catholic teaching on certain issues and be able to articulate them and state them when needed.

Help people discover answers to question about the Catholic faith; you'll be surprised at what you may also learn in the process

Pass along religious books or CDs

There is one more thing that you can do to share the faith so that it is more personal: share your faith story. Share with someone how Jesus changed your life or how Jesus helped you through a difficult time. Just sharing your story can change someone's life and start them on the journey to knowing Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

We should also realize that evangelizing is living as Disciples of Christ. We have to stop hiding behind our irrelevance, blending in so well that people can't see the difference. It's the difference that sets the world free. We should be living a life that is joyful—a life that makes people ask, "Why are you different? Why are you so joyful and at peace all the time?" Be ready and happy to tell them about our Lord Jesus Christ.
