### DAY 1 - Sept. 8, Sunday USA - WARSAW

Depart from the USA on an overnight flight to Warsaw. Dinner and breakfast onboard. /D./

### DAY 2 - Sept. 9, Monday WARSAW

After arrival, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. Afternoon a walking tour of Old Town followed by very elegant welcome dinner. /B.D./

### DAY 3 - Sept. 10, Tuesday WARSAW - WILANOW

After breakfast a sightseeing tour of Old Town, beautifully rebuilt after World War II, with the impressive Royal Castle with its 300 rooms (will visit the Canaletto Room with 23 of his paintings, the Throne Room, the magnificent Knight's Hall and the Royal Ballroom). Afternoon we drive to Wilanow to the beautiful Baroque royal residence park and gardens built in 1674-96 by King Jan III Sobieski. Over the centuries the palace belonged to many Polish noble families like: Sienawskis, Czartoryskis, Lubomirskis, Potockis and Branickis. Dinner in Wilanow. Overnight in Warszawa. /B.L./

### DAY 4 - Sept. 11, Wednesday WARSAW - NIEPOKALANOW - CZESTOCHOWA

Morning departure for Czestochowa to visit the Jasna Gora Monastery and the Black Madonna Shrine. On the way we visit and attend the Mass at the Monastery in Niepokalanow, established by St. Maksymilian Kolbe in 1927, who gave his life in exchange for the life of another man in Auschwitz concentration camp in August 1941. Afternoon we arrive in Czestochowa. Short tour of Jasna Gora. Overnight in Czestochowa. /B.L./

### DAY 5 - Sept. 12, Thursday CZESTOCHOWA - ZAKOPANE

Holy Mass at the Virgin Mary Shrine housing the icon of Black Madonna, Jasna Góra's most precious treasure to which miraculous powers are attributed. Founded in 1382 by Pauline monks from Hungary. From here we continue to sightseeing of breath-taking Zakopane Enjoyable evening of walking tour of famous Krupowki street. Later you will have a chance to admire Zakopane from the top of the Gubalowka mountain. Overnight in Zakopane. /B.L./

### DAY 6 - Sept. 13, Friday ZAKOPANE

Today we explore Zakopane. Beautifully situated at the foot of the Tatra Mountains, in the valley between Gubalowka and Giewont. It is the most popular resort and one of the most beautiful places in all of Poland. After Breakfast, we continue our excursion to Morskie Oko, the largest and most majestic lake in Tatras. On the way back, we will visit Jaszczurowka Chapel and St. Mary's of Czestochowa Church, the oldest wooden church in Zakopane built between 1847-1851. Dinner with folkloric show at one of Highlander's famous restaurant. Overnight in Zakopane. /B.D./

### DAY 7 - Sept. 14, Saturday ZAKOPANE - LAGIEWNIKI - KRAKOW

Morning departure for Krakow via Lagiewniki where we will visit the Divine Mercy Sanctuary associated with life of St. Sister Faustyna Kowalska, and the cult of Divine Mercy. After arrival in Krakow, we tour the magnificent Wawel Castle. This most priceless complex was a home of three Polish royal dynasties of Piasts, Jagiellonians and Wazas for six centuries. Overnight in Krakow. /B.D./

### DAY 8 - Sept. 15, Sunday KRAKOW - WIELICZKA

Today we visit the famous St. Mary's Basilica, Cloth Hall and Old Market Square built in 1349. Next we drive to Wieliczka, the oldest salt mine in Europe. We explore the underground world of salt chambers, monuments and fabulous St. Kinga Chapel with its beautiful chandeliers, a masterpiece carved in salt by generations of Polish miners. Overnight in Krakow. /B.D./

### DAY 9 - Sept. 16, Monday KRAKOW - AUSCHWITZ - WADOWICE

After breakfast, we leave for Auschwitz, the site of the former Nazi Concentration Camp Auschwitz-Birkenau. In the afternoon, we return to Krakow via Wadowice, the birthplace of Pope John Paul II. You will visit the house where he was born and grew up and the Basilica where he was baptized. We attend the Holy Mass. Overnight in Krakow. /B.L./

### DAY 10 - Sept. 17, Tuesday KRAKOW - WARSZAWA

After breakfast, visit specialty stores and gift shops to pick up unique and cool souvenirs. From here we drive to Warszawa. Free time in afternoon in Warszawa. In the evening, Farewell Dinner at one of famous restaurant in Old Town. Overnight in Warszawa. /B.D./

### DAY 11 - Sept. 18, Wednesday WARSAW

**Net Proceeds from May 5 Pancake Breakfast to Help Continuing K of C Aid for Persecuted Mid East Christians.**

Pancakes are coming May 5 and will be supporting a continuing K of C program to help persecuted Christians in the Middle East. Net proceeds from the Council’s third pancake breakfast of the fraternal year will be added to the more than \$20 million in aid the K of C has sent to the war-torn region in the last two years. If you haven’t signed up to help at the breakfast, give DGK Frank Gariepy, the pancake boss, a call at 248-982-7782. Food servers, dishwashers and coffee pourers are needed for the 9 AM to Noon serving period. No experience necessary; on the job training will be provided.

Members and their families are encouraged to attend the annual Council Memorial Mass and reception May 16. Remember to either wear your Council shirt or business attire with your Council badge. The Mass will begin at 7 PM and will honor the brother Knights who have died since our founding in 2005. Surviving family members of those Knights have been invited to the Memorial.

Although a full slate of officers were nominated at the April 16 Membership Meeting, additional nominations will be accepted until the election which is scheduled during the May 21 Membership Meeting. Nominated for re-election were Grand Knight Dave Bednarski, DGK Frank Gariepy, Chancellor Terry Garbinski, Recorder Roger Stacey, Treasurer Rich Rosowski, Advocate Jerome Williams, Warden Patrick Rogers PGK, and Trustee Bill Croitori. Facing election for the first time are the nominees for the guard positions -- Jerry Weigold and Thom Seabolt.

Three other officer positions – Financial Secretary, Membership Director and Program Director – held respectively by Bob Kuhr, PGK Rich Smith and Tom McPhail, are appointed. They are expected to be reappointed.

During the April meeting, District Deputy Don Garon presented the State Chaplain award to the Council and Membership Director Smith. The award was made because our Council attained its 2018-19 membership quota in the first six months of the year. Only seven other Councils in the state matched that achievement.




