



STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS


My youngest son has occasional bouts with asthma. When it hits him, he feels like he is almost drowning, gasping for air. It is a terrible thing to think about, suffocating with no option for air. Luckily, an inhaler opens up that which was closed and air comes rushing back inside his lungs.

The Latin words "spiritus" and "spirare" mean "breath" and "to breathe." It is how we get the word "spirit" and the name, "Holy Spirit," for it is the Spirit in us that gives us breath. Some describe the Spirit as that which provides life and animation to all living things, a life force of sorts. In essence, we live and breathe the Spirit all around us.

I have to admit, that is not as concrete an explanation of the Holy Spirit as I would like. But what I do know is that when the Spirit came upon them at Pentecost, they were undeniably changed and a force came through them that they recorded like a "strong driving wind." This enabled them to proclaim the good news in a way that was previously impossible.

When I see my son trying so hard to breathe, it is like someone or something has robbed him of his spirit, or the Spirit, and he has to struggle. When his ability to breathe is returned to him, he is well again and able to accomplish anything he sets his mind to do. If we were more mindful of our breathing as the Holy Spirit moving through us, I think we would act much differently than we do sometimes. We would be better stewards and just better people. On this Pentecost, may the Spirit that you breathe in each and every day fill your heart and soul with the desire to do great things and do them well! *Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS © Liturgical Publications , Inc.*

Since the missionaries are easily available to travel to seek support for their ministry, we - their brothers in the Order - visit various parishes to ask for help for the success of the missions.

Our presence in South Africa has borne much fruit over the 70 years we have been there. From only a handful of Christians the Church has grown to dozens of communities, several priests and members of our Order - (there are 8 students now in the seminary preparing for ordination) - and several thousands of faithful parishioners. We are responsible for founding schools - there weren't any when we arrived - and are proud of our well-reputed high school, all of which the students were well prepared for college.

The people to whom we minister are generally very poor. Besides the support of your prayers and good Christian example, the missions need financial help to provide for the construction and maintenance of the churches and schools they build, as well as support of the missionaries and for medical help of the people in an area where there aren't many hospitals or medical personnel, and to be able to have transportation to get around the large territory through which they must travel.

So we are most grateful to you for the opportunity to visit with you, and we thank you for any help you can provide to spread the word of salvation to people who had never heard the good news. We ask God's blessing on you for your hospitality and kind consideration.

All Parish Men Invited to Join Knights in Prayerful Reflection on Being a Real Catholic Man

All men of the parish are invited to an Hour of Reflection on *Being a Real Catholic Man* at 7 PM, Tuesday, June 11. Past Grand Knight Patrick Rogers will be the program facilitator. The program is based on an Apostolic Exhortation by the Rev. Thomas J. Olmstead, Bishop of Phoenix. He warned that "One of the key reasons the Church is faltering under the attacks of Satan is that many Catholic men have not been willing to 'step in the breach' – to fill the gap that lies open and venerable to further attack. A large number have left the faith and many who remain 'Catholic' practice the faith timidly and are only minimally committed to passing the faith on to their children." Among the topics covered will be the modern day attack on fatherhood, a brief exploration of the three masculine loves of a man, the important role of grandfathers and the impact of pornography. Also offered, will be some suggested steps men can take to strengthen their faith and their role as fathers.
